Burn Center Referral Cheat Sheet

The UC San Diego Health Regional Burn Center strives to provide quality care to all patients in San Diego and Imperial Counties who experience a burn injury. We are happy to see any burn patients that you feel need our attention! Here are a few tips on patients you may see in your department and when and how to refer them to our Burn Center.

Burn Severity Determination

- 1° Superficial: red, sometimes painful
- 2° Partial Thickness: red, blistered, swollen, very painful
- 3° Full Thickness: White, charred or translucent, no sensation in Palm Method Using the patient's palm as 1% of their TBSA burned area.

Calculating Total Body Surface Area (TBSA%)

- Only include 2° and 3° burns in the TBSA%
- Rule of nines estimated size based on body part
- to roughly calculate the size of a burn
- Hint: If there are formed or popped blisters, or sloughed skin it is AT LEAST a 2° burn!

Who to transfer or refer?

We are happy to see any burn patients that you feel need our attention!

- If you would like to refer a patient please call us ASAP at 619-543-6502!
- We can help you determine if the patient needs to be seen immediately or follow up in our clinic.
- We can also help you decide what dressings to put on the wound. ALWAYS call us for assistance!
- Delays in seeking care at our burn center can have severe consequences for the patient, including causing unnecessary pain, surgery, and permanent scarring. We are here to help you and your patient!
- Please, **never** tell a patient to just come to our unit without an appointment!

American Burn Association Burn Center Referral Criteria

- 1. Partial thickness burns (2°) greater than 10% total body surface area (TBSA)
- 2. Burns that involve the face, hands, feet, genitalia, perineum, or major joints
- 3. Full thickness burns (3°) in any age group
- 4. Electrical burns, including lightning injury
- 5. Chemical burns
- 6. Inhalation injury

- 7. Burn injury in patients with preexisting medical disorders that could complicate management, prolong recovery, or affect mortality
- 8. Any patient with burns and trauma (such as fractures) in which the burn injury poses the greatest risk of morbidity or mortality
- 9. Burned children in hospitals without qualified personnel or equipment for the care of children
- 10. Burn injury in patients who will require special social, emotional, or rehabilitative intervention

How to arrange immediate transfer or refer for follow-up Call the Burn Center and speak to the Charge RN at 619-543-6502

If transferring immediately:

- o Medicate for pain with PO or IV pain meds
- Determine and arrange appropriate transport method
- Cover wounds with dry gauze
- Call report to Charge RN

o For critical patients the Charge RN will arrange MD to MD communication

If referring for follow-up appointment:

- Treat pain and prescribe pain medications
- o Dress wounds as discussed with Burn Charge RN
- o **Give** patient enough wound care supplies for at least 2 days
- O Please, never tell a patient to just come to our unit without an appointment!
- o Give the patient the Burn Clinic phone number (619-543-6505) and tell them to call at 8am on the next regular business day to schedule follow up appointment
- o For questions after 5pm on weekdays and all-day on the weekends let the patient know they can call 619-543-6502!
